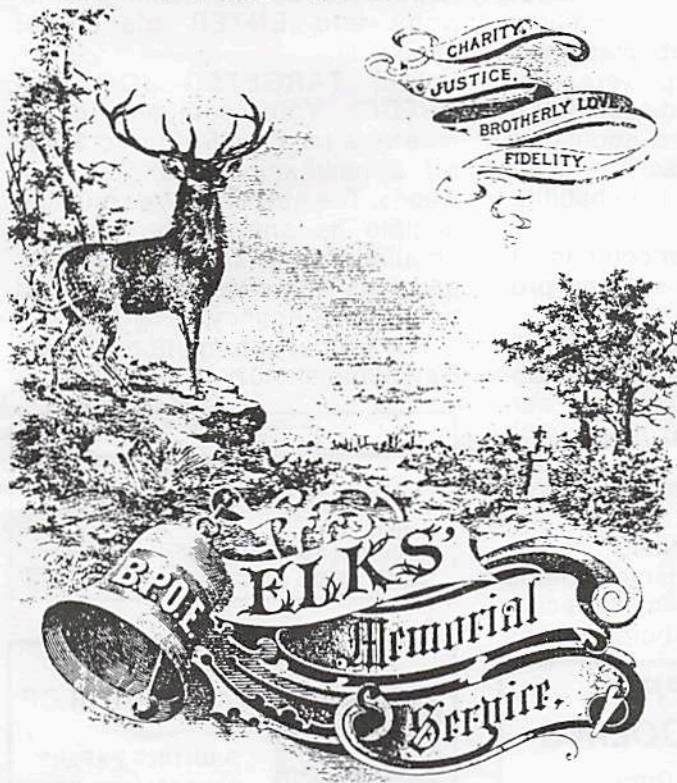

EIKS ENTER Program

The Elks Of Nebraska Training, Employment, and Rehabilitation (ENTER) Program is an employment referral and job placement network linking employers with Nebraskans who are disabled. It is a cooperative venture sponsored by the Elks of Nebraska and the Nebraska Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS).

DRS can assist your company in applying for dollar-saving programs.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT: When needed, DRS can provide on-the-job training and support services to ensure maximum work productivity. These services are provided on an ongoing basis at no cost to the employer.

ON-THE-JOB TRAINING: Monies are available to companies willing to train new employees in specific skills. DRS will reimburse wages

paid to the trainee at a percentage negotiated by the training company and ENTER placement specialist.

THE TARGETED JOB TAX CREDIT: Your company could receive a tax credit of up to \$2400 off a new employees first year wages. The new employee must be eligible as one of the targeted populations, which includes individuals with disabilities serviced by the DRS Agency.

A tribute to the memory of those who have passed into the realm of everlasting peace. May they look down upon us and behold that, true to the motto of our Order, we have kept faith and inscribed their virtues upon the tablets of love and memory.

The Obligation. . .

The obligation which is assumed by every member of the Order, as an essential part of his initiation, involves certain duties which are necessarily implied, as well as those which are formally expressed.

By that obligation, so assumed, he becomes a member of The Order of Elks, not merely a member of his own Lodge. The rights and privileges thereby conferred upon him include the right to attend the meetings of any other subordinate lodge, and to avail himself of the facilities of any club house maintained by such other lodge, in accordance with its rules and regulations relating thereto. And he is as much amenable to the Grand Lodge Statutes as he is to the By-Laws of his own lodge.

He is entitled to participate in the deliberations of his own lodge; and it is his duty to attend the meetings for that purpose, with proper regard for other duties which may also rest upon him. He shares the responsibility for its

acts; and he should, by his vote in lodge sessions and by the appropriate exercise of his influence, endeavor to have those acts reflect his own views. But he should, with good grace, yield to majority will when it has been duly registered.

The charitable and benevolent activities of his lodge frequently require the personal attention of members other than its officers. Each member should readily respond to any official call upon him for any fraternal service that may be within his reasonable capacity to render.

It is only by the continued display of such a spirit of fraternal cooperation that his lodge can maintain itself as the instrumentality of community service it is designed to be. And it is only by generously putting his individual service into his fraternal association that he will secure for himself in greatest measure the satisfaction and happiness which should attend membership in the Order.

Nebraska Elks Association Presents Flag to Nebraska

A 12x20-foot American flag was presented to the state of Nebraska on Sept. 24 by the Nebraska Elks Association. Bill Orr, stepping in for Gov. Kay Orr, accepted the flag for the people of the state in a brief ceremony on the north steps of the Capitol, and turned the flag over to the Nebraska Army National Guard to raise on the state flag pole.

The presentation expressed support for the American armed forces in Saudi Arabia by the 25,000 members of the Nebraska Elks Association. The association, at a meeting in Scottsbluff, renewed their support, love, prayers,

respect and appreciation to all who so faithfully serve and give so much that we may live in peace.

The flag was obtained by the Cozad Elks Lodge and presented to State President Herschel Baird of Scottsbluff, who, in turn, presented it to Bill Orr. According to the State Elks Americanism Chairman, Earl Cummings of Alliance, the presentation included a brief ceremony before the flag raising, with a reemphasis of Elks' dedication to patriotism, and an expression of support for the American activities in the Midwest.
