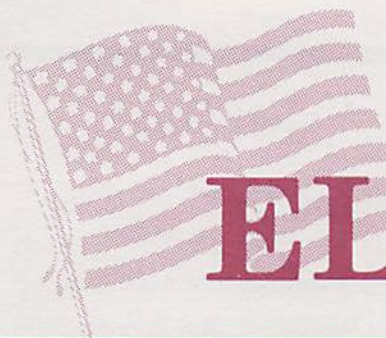

Your Lodge is NOT a place for public accommodation and you must operate under *THE CLOSED DOOR POLICY*. Members and their guests are the only persons to be allowed in our facilities. Every person requesting admittance should present their PRESENT membership card. Without it they should be turned away.

Your attention to Grand Lodge Statute 14.130, which states in part:

"Subject to state and local laws, the use of the home or club facilities shall be limited to members in good standing in the order, their spouses and guest of members and those receiving identification cards under Section 14.140, as provided in the house rules, so as to preserve the privacy of the use of such facilities to members of the order. Subordinate lodges shall take appropriate action to conform to the provisions of this section."

Every member and every lodge is **URGED** to **COMPLY** immediately with this statute.

Failure to completely comply subjects your Lodge to forfeiture of your charter.

Lincoln Lodge No. 80 dues are now separated from Grand Lodge and State Association assessments.

Grand Lodge Assessments this year are:	\$10.25
State Association Assessments are:	1.25
Lodge Dues are now:	<u>60.00</u>
Total due 4/1/95	\$71.50

Semi-annual Dues on 4/1/95 will be:	\$30.00
Plus Grand Lodge Assessments	10.25
Plus State Association Assessments	<u>1.25</u>
Total due 4/1/95	\$41.50

On 10/1/95 the remaining \$30.00 will be due.

Life Members & Honorary Life Members will be assessed Grand Lodge and State Association fees of	\$10.25
Plus Lodge Administration expense of	<u>5.00</u>
Total of	\$16.50

Prior to this time Grand Lodge and State Association Assessments were included with the dues and if there was a Grand Lodge increase the Lodge had to absorb the loss or amend the By-Laws. The purpose of this is to allow us to increase or decrease the assessments without amending the By-Laws for a nickel or whatever the change amounts to.
