The Lincoln Elks Lodge ENTER (Elks of Nebraska Training Employment and Rehabilitation) committee hosted a continental breakfast May 23, 1995 for local business people.

The featured speaker was Frank Lloyd, Director of Vocational Rehabilitation for the State of Nebraska. Vince Collura PGER, along with members of the ENTER committee were present to provide information about the Elks part in this major project of the Elks program.



The program was to help business people learn about the ENTER program and what employers can obtain by hiring people with disabilities. Our local lodge calls on businesses to seek employment for people with disabilities, working very closely with the State Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

Vocational Rehabilitation helps consumers set job goals and prepare for work, and the Elks ENTER

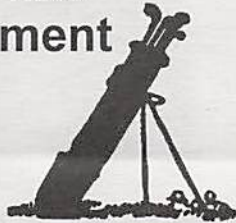

### LINCOLN ELKS LODGE #80 HOUSE RULES

1. All rules pertain to all members and their guests. This Club is for the use of the members in good standing in Lincoln Lodge #80. (a.) Members are responsible for the actions of their guests. (b.) All guests (except wives and minor children) must sign the Register.
2. Guests eligible for membership must make application for membership after no more than (3) visits to the club as a guest. (a.) Dropped or inactive members will not be considered guests and are not allowed to use Club facilities (except for the purpose of reinstatement).
3. Always remember that an Elk is a gentleman. Please act accordingly. Conduct unbecoming of a Brother, including profanity, loud or abusive behavior shall be subject to discipline.
4. Visiting Elks in good standing in their Lodge are welcome as long as they observe our House Rules.
5. Children over 12 years old will only be permitted in the Lounge and Party Room while under the direct supervision of their parents. No minors may be seated at the bar or play any Charity games.
6. The operation and management shall be supervised and conducted by the House Committee of the Lodge.
7. The Club room shall be open during such hours as the House Committee shall direct.
8. If, in the judgement of the Bartender in charge, an individual is in an intoxicated condition, further service will be denied.
9. Credit or tabs on food and non-alcoholic beverages will be permitted if settled the same day (PAID). No tabs on alcoholic beverages or Charity games such as Pickle cards, punch boards.
10. Only one \$50.00 check per day will be cashed by members if funds are available.
11. Harassment of employees will not be permitted.
12. The bar will remain closed during the regular Lodge meeting.
13. The Lodge will not be responsible for lost or stolen articles.
14. Any willful or malicious destruction of any property of the Lodge will be paid for by the person responsible.
15. Live animals shall not be permitted on the Lodge premises.
16. Any violation of these rules and regulations may subject a member or guest to the loss of club privileges.
17. All Elks in Lincoln Lodge's jurisdiction shall be members of Lincoln Lodge, and members of other Lodges must be associate members to use these Club facilities.
18. House Committee shall have the power to make temporary rules and regulations in all cases not provided for in these rules. Any recommendations or changes of these House Rules should be reduced to writing and submitted to the House Committee.

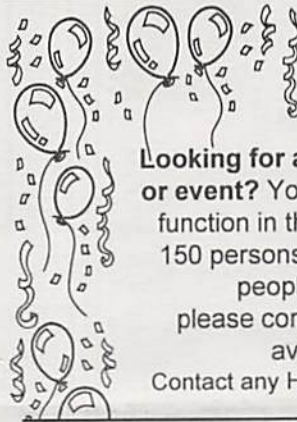
