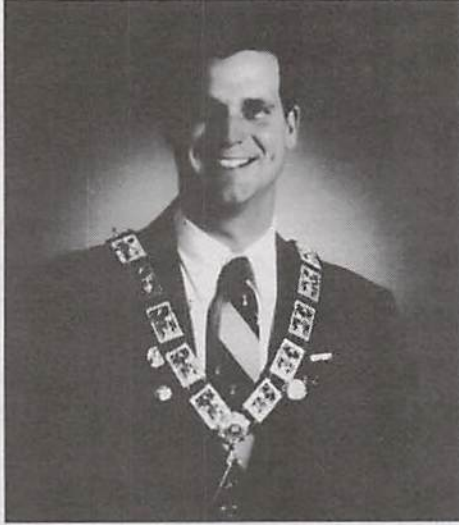

Charitable Fund Board Sets Scholarship Amount for 1998

The Charitable Fund Board met September 9th and set the following scholarship amounts to be awarded during the 1997-98 school year.

Jensen - two	\$250. awards. (One male and one female)

In addition the Board established four new scholarships to be awarded for the first time in 1998.

The Hollingshead Scholarship - a \$150 scholarship for a student enrolling in a Nebraska Vocational / Trade School

The Bowling League Scholarship - a \$100 scholarship for a student enrolling in a Nebraska Vocational / Trade School

The J. Durst Elementary Education Scholarship - a \$500/year, four year scholarship for a student majoring in Elementary Education.

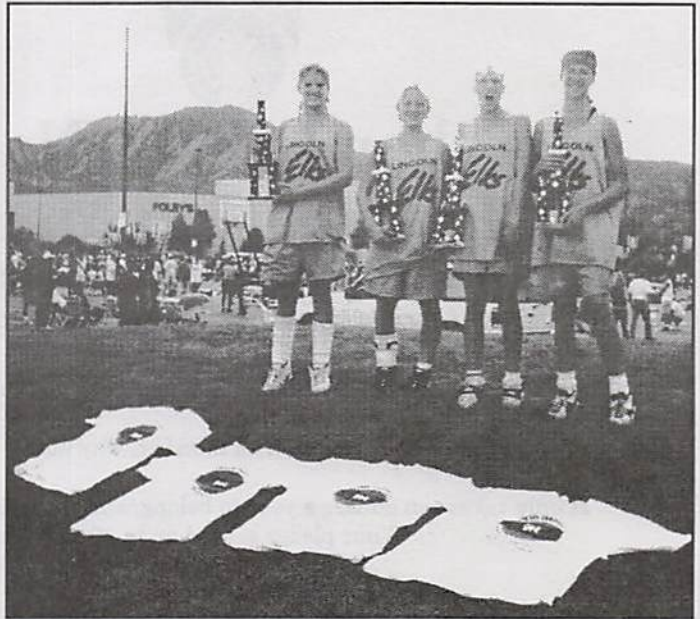
The W. Durst Science Education Scholarship - a \$500/year, four year scholarship for a student majoring in Science Education.
