Don't Throw Away That Empty Cartridge or Cell Phone! Bring It To The Lodge!

Lodge 80 is launching several fund-raising projects in order to generate more revenue for the lodge. The first program we're launching is the recycling program. This program costs absolutely nothing but still has quite a bit of upside potential. Both empty toner cartridges and empty inkjet cartridges can be recycled and remanufactured. Our lodge will receive cash for each cartridge turned in. This will directly benefit our lodge fund, allowing us to keep prices down and fund our many community programs.

You can help! The inkjet program is easy. Any cartridge with a print head can be recycled, regardless of brand or type. Do you have an HP, Lexmark, Xerox, Compaq, Samsung, Kodak, Canon or Apple printer? Bring in your empty cartridges (use a Ziploc bag to avoid ink spills) to the special recycling bin in the office. (Note: Epson cartridges cannot be recycled - they don't have a print head.)

The toner cartridges and old cell phones work the same way. Just bring them in to the lodge office and we will receive cash for sending them in. If you have questions about the program, or want to see if the brand you want to donate is recyclable, call Gary Korisko at 540-4279.
