Starting in April every year, we draft 1/12<sup>th</sup> of the dues (we round to the nearest quarter) for the ensuing year (2027/28 at this time). That means that all your dues will be painlessly paid by March 2027, and your membership card simply appears in the mail. If you would like to enroll in this program, please email me at the address below and I'll send you the form. I need to have your form returned no later than March 25, so don't dilly-dally!

Final notice letters went out to the nine members that are still delinquent on this year's dues: Jacob Bliven, Katie Bohling, Ron Bonebright, Jason Brooks, Matthew Brody, Chad Gustin, Paul Holt, Jennifer Hubbard, and Harry Malone. If you know any of them, please encourage them to pay their 2025/2026 dues, and if they are no longer interested in being an active Elk, to then request an honorable absolute dimit before March 18, our final meeting of the year. This is important because every May, the Lodge must pay per capita to Grand Lodge based on our membership at March 31, and for every member who does not pay their dues, the other lodge members assume the burden of making up that per capita. The per capita for nine members comes to over \$325, enough to pay our average one-month electric bill!

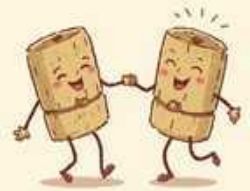
**KARAOKE AT THE LODGE**

# VOLUNTEER NEWS

If you're wondering how you can help out your fellow Elks or the community at large, here are some other ways:

**We Can Do This** is a program providing nutritious meal kits for children over the weekends when school lunch is not available. We have a collection barrel at the lodge, since the program also has a small pantry for families that is always in need of the food and hygiene items.

Did you know that many low-income families are forced to adopt a vegetarian diet due to the price of animal proteins these days? Cans of chicken, tuna and ham, and other shelf-stable meats are helpful and easy to prepare. Please include these among the other shelf-stable items you bring to share with those less fortunate than us.

Other things they always need: Toilet Paper, Dish Soap, Paper Towels, Cereal, Instant Potatoes, Mac & Cheese, Canned Fruit, Canned Vegetables (with pull tabs if possible), Knorr (or store brand) noodles/rice, and Ramen. These items help the kids and their families help themselves. What doesn't get used right away goes into a pantry for kids and their families.

**The Veteran's Pantry** is a monthly outreach program at Victory Park apartments on the VA campus, which serves veterans who have been or are at risk of being homeless. These former service members live on limited incomes and every bit helps to stretch 15664 their food budgets. Milt Schmidt spearheads this effort.

Recent needs at the pantry include paper towels, toilet paper, laundry soap pods, instant (water needed only) mac and cheese, canned vegetables, tuna, canned chicken, breakfast cereal and shelf stable items.

Mainly, the pantry needs volunteers to help set up, distribute, and take down the afternoon of the last Tuesday each month.

**And simplest of all:** Come to the dinners each month. Donate a little something to the raffle (even a \$10 family size package of pub mix, homemade bread, golf tees and balls, or whatever your skilled craft produces). Come to Beer and Burger Nite. And come to the meetings a few times a year. It's not a lot of effort to be involved and it's good for everyone. We love to see you!
