Christmas Party 2018!

The 111th Children's Christmas Party was held at Pinnacle Bank Arena on a warm December 16th afternoon. The temperature was in the mid 50's, above the normal mid to upper 30's temperatures for this time of year. The attendance for this year's party was 1511 people, up almost 350 over last year. Everywhere you looked there were kids running around with toys, enjoying the candy they received as they entered the arena, and dancing to the Christmas music provided by Dorothy Applebee. Dorothy has been playing the organ and providing Christmas music at the Children's Christmas Party for over Forty years. What an accomplishment! Dorothy goes out of her way to accommodate our Christmas party. THANK YOU DOROTHY for your many years of entertaining the children and families of Lincoln at our Children's Christmas Parties.

On Thursday, December 13th, 50 people participated in the sacking party on the fifth level of the arena. We had two assembly lines set up, and churned out 1999 bags of goodies (SOMEONE tore one of the sacks, so we didn't have an even 2000 bags). The delivery of the items for the goody bags was accomplished by the finely coordinated teams of Larry Jurgens, & Harry Montag (apples and oranges from the Super Saver on 27th & Cornhusker), Larry Bratt (candy) and Larry Schwindt (snacks from the North Sam's). A huge THANK YOU goes out to Tran at Super Saver for getting us such high quality apples and oranges.

Shopping for the toys was done by Larry Bratt, Nancy Kennedy, Larry & Vicki Jurgens, Larry Schwindt, and Tami Nordman. To add to the toy collection some people dropped toys off at the Lodge and Sonny Lane's business networking group donated 47 additional toys. Thank you Sonny for coordinating and delivering your group's donations. Overall we had 378 toys to distribute at the Christmas party.

On Saturday morning December 15th, Scott Jurgens provided an enclosed trailer, which Vicki Jurgens, Nancy Kennedy, Larry Bratt, and Larry Schwindt loaded with all of the toys. While the trailer was being loaded, Scott & Larry Jurgens, Scott Schrage, and Harry Montag went to pick up Santa's sleigh. Many thanks go to Tom Roper for storing Santa's sleigh for us during the year, and picking it up after the party was over.

On Sunday morning, December 16th, Larry & Vicki Jurgens delivered the toys to the Arena, and Larry & Wyatt Schwindt, Larry & Vicki Jurgens, Larry Bratt, and Nancy Kennedy unloaded the trailer. The toys were then sorted by age and displayed for easy viewing and selection by the kids. Heather Pedersen's music students were on hand once again to set the tone for the event by providing Christmas music as everyone entered. Entertainment was provided by Juggler/Comedian Dan Bennet, and Magician Janene Harris, and once again Steffany Lien was able to be with us to WOW the kids with her amazing baton twirling skills. Harry and Laurie Montag were our Master of Ceremonies, and did an outstanding job. There were 44 volunteers who came to out to help with the party, handing out candy, counting people as they entered, distributing toys, and helping Santa. Santa commented that this was the largest number of kids that he could remember who stayed after the entertainment was finished to talk with him.

Of special note, five Lighting & Sound Technicians from Pinnacle Bank Arena Volunteered their time to set up and tear down the lighting and microphone systems for the performers. They were there from early morning to set up, and until after Santa had finished talking with the kids to do the tear down. I'd like to thank them very much for their time and efforts to make our party the best it could be.

I would also like to thank JP at KZKX radio for promoting our event on his show. JP is Program Director and Morning Show Host at 96 KX, and is also a coach for one of our youth football teams. THANK YOU JP!

This event couldn't have taken place without all of the people who came out to volunteer at both the sacking party and the Christmas party, and also those who generously donated to this wonderful event. It makes me proud to call myself an Elk when you see the smiles and laughter during the party, and know that we all had a part in providing such a wonderful event for the community.

Knight's Tales

As I gaze out my windows and observe the stark whiteness of my back yard, I can only think of the time we have left of this winter and look with much anticipation to the spring. As of the time of this writing, there are only 61 more days left of this white stuff and there is more on its way. We have been "blessed" this year with a somewhat mild winter, but when winter peeks its head around the corner it sure does let you know it's here. When I look at the old Farmers Almanac, it states that January temperature should be 5degrees above normal, but we could expect more moisture (snow). Now February our shortest month, the almanac prognosticated a 7degree temperature increase over the average and average precipitation. (Only if I was a betting man.) Oh well! As I was taught "it's winter in the Midwest; might be different from year to year but you can always expect cold temperatures and some snow".

I don't know if you had read the article on the Elks Website called If I could "I Could Live Again". The article is about a young veteran mother by the name of Rose who loves being a mom to her 11-year-old twin daughters. Like most parents, Rose works day in, day out to keep the rent paid, the lights on and her children fed. I bring this up because it illuminates where your contribution to ENF goes. I am not trying to be political but facts are facts. Your ENF has contributed over 4 million to help end veteran homelessness. The money funds the Elks National Veterans Service Commission's Welcome Home initiative, which includes an Emergency Assistance Fund for veterans in eight metropolitan areas targeted by the V.A. for increased focus by the Elks. To date, the Elks have helped more than 1,350 veterans exit or avoid homelessness through emergency assistance. That's something that should melt the snow off your driveway!

Something that we all need to be made aware of is that our society's hidden crisis, the drug crisis, is taking a deadly toll on a group you might not expect: middle-aged women. A new report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reveals that drug overdose deaths among females aged 30 to 64 have skyrocketed in recent years. According to the report, from 1999 to 2017, the drug overdose death rate in this age group increased 260 percent. The rate rose from 6.7 deaths per 100,000 people (4,314 overdose deaths total) to 24.3 per 100,000 (18,110 overdose deaths).

In the middle of month I am sure that you heard that 27 and 28 year old parents were charged in the death of their 18 month daughter, the reason was that the infant was found to have an "extraordinary" amount of fentanyl in her system at the time of her death.

I am sure that you have heard that in our Unicameral The Legislature's Judiciary Committee advanced Legislative Bill 622, sponsored and prioritized by State Sen. Anna Wishart of Lincoln, 6-1. It deals with the legalization of medical marijuana. Senator Wishart said supporters will have to work hard to educate lawmakers about how the medical cannabis program would operate. We will keep you posted.

Finally, the end of the long and somewhat unpredictable NFL season is upon us. We are having a Superbowl watch party at the Lodge Sunday, February 3rd. Kick Off is at 6:30. Please bring something to share with all.

Chaplain's Corner

"Is That All There Is?"

Elks Lodge 80 Chaplain, Dr. William Jackson

Service by mankind's definition refers to working in performance of an occupation, business, or consultation; as well as duties for a superior as a subordinate (Farley, 2019. the Free Dictionary [Online]).

Service from Holy Scripture offers three references from the Hebrew and Greek perspective. There is Sharath, "to attend", as a worshipper giving their time and talent to the Lord when and where required (Exodus 35:19; 39:1,41). There is Tsabha', "numbered for service" as for war, campaign, and hardship (Numbers 4:30,35,39,43; 8:24). Finally, there is Diakonia (Greek), "ministry", where you serve the Lord by serving His church and those still unsaved (2 Corinthians 11:8; Revelation 2:19).

Unfortunately, you do not get to choose which of those service options to follow. God does that for you, through the fruits of His spirit to you (Galatians 5: 22, 23). Keep in mind Jesus' parable about "talents"; i.e., God's expectation of us to use and multiply His gifts for His purpose and the further salvation of humankind (Matthew 25:14-30).

Another consideration for your service is...why...? Do YOU know why you've accepted the Lord's salvation? Do you know what He EXPECTS of you as His adopted son or daughter?

How active are you with the Church, and those who don't know the Lord? You are an evangelist, right, as part of His great commission (Matthew 28:16-20)? Don't worry. This is not a judgment thing, and no one knows YOU like the Lord does.

Maybe it's time to take stock of yourself; a sort of self-admonishment, if you will (Colossians 3:16). The Lord does not need you to save humanity. But He does want you as part of His church of believers to witness to your fellow humans who need His salvation.

Are you up for it? The Lord is. How about making that move in your soul/mind to get right with the Lord, the way you know you should be doing. No judgment again. Just that admonishment already discussed. If you love the Lord, I know you'll be worthy of His commission.




