Partner with other service organizations to create a community-wide event. One of the best ways to honor our former Members who gave all for our freedoms is to place flowers and American flags on their graves.

Coming in June is Father's Day and Flag Day. Grand Lodge Convention starts at the end of the month so register as soon as possible. Lastly, make sure to conduct all local and Grand Lodge programs. By doing so, you are truly "Working Together to Make a Difference."



So, if this turkey wants to join, we all need to look around our "social yard" and see how many of your favorite


"turkeys" you know that need to peck on our front door and join this great group of folks.






## **A Jolly Corker Update**

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics consumer price index, today's prices in 2019 are 13.01% higher than average prices throughout 2011.

The dollar experienced an average inflation rate of 1.54% per year during this period, meaning the real value of a dollar decreased.
