House Rules!



On behalf of all of the members of Lincoln Elks Lodge 80, we would like to thank you for attending our August lodge dinner. We all feel honored that you were able to attend and your presence at this event was very much appreciated!

In order for us to gain an understanding of our House rules, this article will explore our rules of operation them in the coming months. This month lets take a look at House rules #11 #16 and # 25.

11. Minors shall not be seated at the bar

- Nebraska state law dictates that a minor child under 17 years of age shall not be permitted to remain in a dance hall, saloon, bar room or any place where spirituous or intoxicating liquor, wine or beer ... is sold unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. *We are asking that a minor does not seat themselves at the bar.*

16. The Bar and Kitchen shall close at 7:00 PM and remain closed during regular scheduled Lodge meetings.

A) Please note: the kitchen serving time is limited to 11:00 - 1:30. Due to lack of business there is no food service after this time

B) No food or beverages shall be served during the regular Lodge meeting hours. Last call for Lodge Meetings is 6:45pm

25. Compliance with State Liquor Laws shall be observed by all persons who enter, use, or visit the Lodge and Club facilities. This compliance includes but not limited to the following:

A) not obtaining alcohol for minors, bringing liquor or alcoholic beverages in or out of the Lodge, this does include nonalcoholic beverages. *We are asking all members and visitors to purchase all beverages here and to consume them here.*

B) creating a disturbance where such disturbance causes bodily injury or not,

C) sales after hours, consuming after hours, or

D) the sale of alcohol to an intoxicated person.

Nebraska alcohol laws consider driving under the influence (DUI) to be any of these. A BAC of 0.08% or higher, 0.04% for drivers of commercial vehicles, 0.02% for drivers, including adults, under 21


