Did you realize that for the first half of the 19th century (1800's), Christmas was a very different kind of holiday than it is today?

It is hard to imagine that some communities did not celebrate the day at all. An American author who wrote such short stories as Rip Van Winkle and the Legend of Sleepy Hollow penned in 1819, in a book called "The Sketchbook of Geoffrey Crayon, Gent." In this book the author, Washington Irving, describes a wealthy British landowner who invites his farm workers into his home to celebrate Christmas. The landowner recreates a traditional Christmas as it would have been celebrated in the distant past.

Irving praised this looking back to ancient traditions. He liked the idea of different levels of society coming together to enjoy a festive and peaceful holiday. Washington Irving seemed to express concern about the lack of such unifying Christmas traditions in modern America.

By mid-century, Christmas became an important time for families to celebrate at home. More and more Christian Americans also began to follow the European traditions of Christmas trees and giving gifts. Christians believed that the tree represented Jesus and was also a sign of new beginnings. In the past several months we have discussed those old wily Germans. The German immigrants brought their tradition of putting lights, sweets, and toys on the branches of evergreen trees placed in their homes.

As Christmas became more popular, some states declared the day a state holiday. Louisiana was the first state to make the move in 1837. By 1860, 14 other states had followed. It was not until 1870 that President Ulysses Grant made Christmas a federal holiday.

It seems to me that in discussing Christmas, we need to touch briefly on one of the major characters of this holiday. That namely being Santa Claus, (Saint Nicholas) the patron saint of New York. Saint Nicholas was known as a protector of children. In his role as a Christmas hero, different cultures have given him different names. These include Sinterklaas, Kris Kringle, and Father Christmas. But for most Americans his most popular name would become Santa Claus.

In this season remember we all belong to a very generous charitable foundation that offers a helping hand to youth, and friendship to veterans. I would like to thank you for being a part of something greater than each one of us, without you, we would simply not exist.


